Parsonage Update

After two years of research and over three months on the market we officially closed on the sale of the former parsonage Thursday August 8th. The offer approved by council was for \$325,000 with a \$6,500 credit toward the buyer's closing plus our traditional standard closing costs.

I am grateful to the new owners for showing an interest in preserving this fine old house and that they shared in the cost of the corrective action items from the inspectors list. To express their interest in the home the new owners wrote a heartwarming message to the church, this house truly seems to be a blessing for him.

This was only possible because of the hard work and dedication of many of our members. For over two years the Parsonage task force lead by Yvonne Kulma and her dedicated team analyzed all angles before making their recommendation to council. For this I say Thank You!

Prior and current council members spent many hours pondering what move they felt was in the best interest of Advent Lutheran Church. Much of this was done during the time Denise McClanahan held the role of Council President. For this I say Thank You!

During the actual selling process Pastor Steve, Sue Keeley, Dave Mattson and Bob Adkins did everything from coordinating the retailer and title company, prepping the house, reviewing documents and everything else that was needed to make the sale possible. For this I say Thank You!

Finally, to all the members of Advent including the 66 people who attended the special congregational meeting that approved listing the house for sale. I say Thank you! God has guided us in this process and will be there with us as we move forward.

Note from our New Neighbor

Dear Board Members,

Thank you for taking the time to look at my offer and to read this note. I'm hopeful that all will work out and we will be neighbors. The house has an abundance of character and is exactly what I was hoping to find upon relocating to the area. I am also aware of the clause stipulating that if I ever decide to sell the property that the Church would have the option of buying it at the market value. I completely accept that clause – it makes sense to me.

Besides the typical military-service connected injuries and rated disabilities one receives from jumping out of airplanes and deploying to Afghanistan over the past two decades, I also developed an ailment that affects my joints. The Cleveland Clinic is one of the leading institutions in the world on its treatment, so my family being here as well as the Clinic is another blessing.

My lifestyle is quite low-key. I am 53 years old and have two dogs who are my constant companions. My oldest daughter is married and lives in Mentor-on-the-Lake, my second eldest lives in Mentor, and my son is studying Wildlife Management at Hocking College in southern Ohio. He is home for the summer and working with Lake Metro Parks, and during our tour of the house and property he was constantly pointing out the different flora and fauna on the property, and we both love that it has woods. Other than cleaning up the downed limbs and brambles, you can rest assured that the wooded area would remain. It is certainly a point that I love about the property.

Again, I thank you for your time and consideration. I maintain a security clearance and have since I was 20 years old. I am certainly a respectful person and wish to assure you that I would be a good neighbor to your organization. I keep my properties tidy and maintained, look after my neighbors, and appreciate a quiet lifestyle.

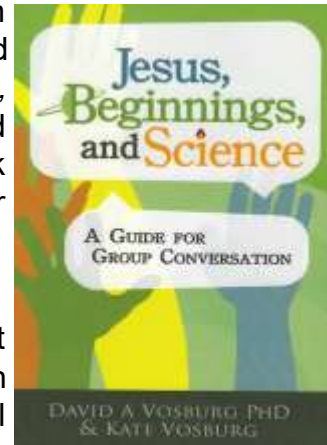

CELEBRATING THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF NORTHEAST OHIO

Have you noticed that more states are recognizing the indigenous peoples of the United States on Columbus Day? In fact, some states are no longer calling the mid-October holiday (on October 14th in 2024) by the traditional name of Columbus Day, but rather, are now celebrating it as Indigenous Peoples Day. Our own ELCA has recognized the colonizing impacts of the past and present by launching the Truth and Healing Movement as part of the churchwide Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations faction of our larger church body.

In conjunction with this, our own Loved By God Ministry is sponsoring an outing! We are touring the Indian Museum of Lake County, Ohio on Saturday, October 19th at 1pm. We will be receiving our own private tour hosted by the director who will talk to us about the native peoples in and around northeast Ohio. People have lived here as long ago as 10,000 years and many of their artifacts are from that time. A sign-up sheet will be in the narthex and directions are easy since it is right here in Lake County. We will not car pool officially. However, those going are free to make arrangements. The museum is at 7519 Mentor Ave., Suite A112. This is in the BACK of the strip mall on Mentor Ave. just west of the mall. There is a big 7519 on the entry door and Suite A112 is marked after you enter. Their web page is www.indianmuseumoflakecounty.org/ The cost for this is \$3.00, cash only. 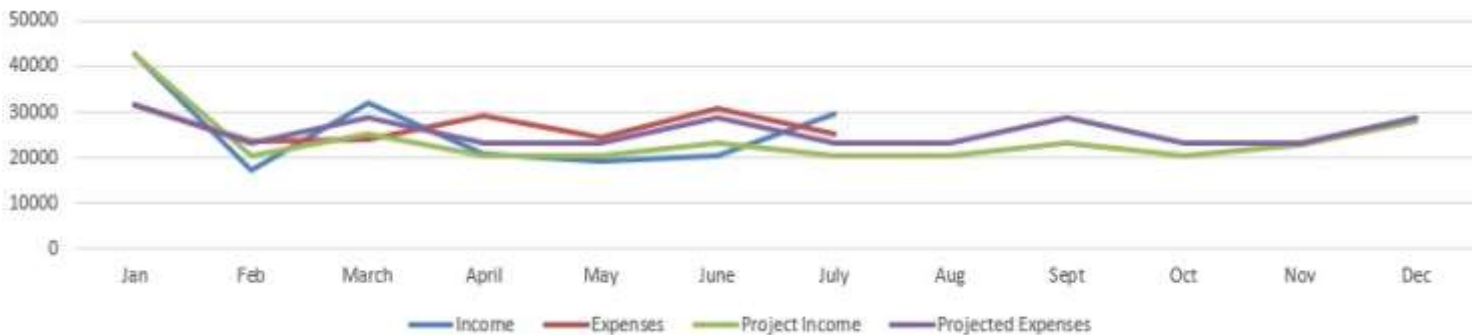
