Reformation

On October 31, 1517, a Roman Catholic monk/priest/college professor, Martin Luther, posted 95 arguments against one practice of the Church at that time – namely, the sale of indulgences. An indulgence was a document declaring the forgiveness of sin or the possession of merits earned by doing a particular "good work." That work might be an act of charity, visit to a holy site, practice of a particular penance or, financial donation to the Church.

These arguments, or "theses" --- were meant to begin a debate with other college faculty and church officials – instead, it became the spark of what became known as the "Protestant Reformation." The very word "reformation" points to a great change. In addition to putting a halt to the sale of indulgences, the Reformation led to a renewed emphasis on Grace, Faith and the authority of scripture. It also brought about worship practiced in the language of the people, a translation of scripture into the language of the people, a shift in the way music was used in worship, a shift in an understanding of the role of the laity (common non-clergy people) and a renewed emphasis on educating ordinary people in the basics of the Christian faith.

With this history – one would think that we would all welcome change whenever it leads to clearer understanding of the Good News of Jesus or to the spread of this Gospel. BUT, we all know that change is difficult for many of us and resisted by many as well.

We recognize the fact that Christ's Church is ever in need of change and re-formation to continue to speak to a changing world. We have always known that the Church is continually reforming. What may be the thing we

need the strongest reminder of, is that part that encourages us to "Embrace change with positivity and purpose!"

It is a time to educate ourselves about the importance of screening each year with an annual mammogram after the age of 40. Each year approximately 240,000 women are diagnosed with breast cancer. Sadly 42,000 of those women die. Far too many. Early detection is key. Being a breast cancer survivor I can attest to the fact that mammograms detect any abnormalities. In January I will be an 8 year survivor! Schedule your mammogram today!

Council Minutes - August

In Attendance (via Zoom & in-person): Pastor Steve, Jo Brantweiner, Bob Adkins, Rob Hilston, Dave Mattson, Joan Hamm, Carla Colo, Andy DiLiello, Ben DeAlexandro, Christine Noble **Call to Order:** 7:00pm

Approval of June Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report: verbal

- Pastor will undergo outpatient surgery on October 6 this will not cause issues for the following weekend's worship. He will rest/light work duty during the week.
- The Synod's Project Isaiah 43 (document on file) was discussed. This is proactive work from the Synod, as with clergy retiring and not enough new clergy coming out of Seminary, there will be a short supply of clergy in the future. This is a continued dialogue with congregations. A reforming in the making, sharing of pastors with multiple congregations. Four ELCA congregations in Lake County – some stronger than others. Possible collaborations with other denominations.
- Four or Five congregations (including Advent) will jointly teach confirmation.
- Pastor Shields, Dean of our Conference, is working on organizing pulpit exchanges with other churches in our cluster. This is a work in progress.

**Motion was made and seconded, and Pastor's report was approved.

Treasurer's Report:

- Income 5.6% above plan; expenses 1.6% above plan.
- Dave will run ministry team reports.
- Total expenses for the parsonage sale (repairs and Pastor's move) will be around \$5,000. This will be deducted from the proceeds from the parsonage sale, which was approx. \$291,000,
- 2025 budgets will be due by the end of September. Please relay info to your ministry teams.
 **Motion was made and seconded, and the June Treasurer's report was approved.
 **Motion was made and seconded, and the July Treasurer's report was approved.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, Finance, W&M, Fellowship and Property (on file)

- H&W: flu clinic will be held, waiting on a date from Walgreens
- **Technology:** Andy's son will be checking the Sanctuary computer, as the recent storms have damaged the computer. A new computer may be needed.
- **Outreach:** Day of Service, September 8. Outdoor Work/Home Work is being planned. Please let Dave Mattson know of anyone in need. One worship service that day at 10am, followed by a potluck and then off to service projects. Sign-up sheets are in the Narthex.
- W&M: Pastor will hold open forum/discussion groups in September (3 different opportunities) to explain why inclusive language is being used/celebrating of indigenous peoples.
 **Motion was made and seconded, and the Ministry reports were approved.

Administration/Housekeeping Items:

Old Business:

• **Parsonage Update:** Sale of the parsonage closed on August 8. Rob briefly reviewed the sale process. Thank you to all involved in the process. Rob was thanked for his leadership and work done with the sale as council president. We received a letter from the buyer, which will be shared in the next newsletter, along with a letter from Rob about the sale.

• **Parsonage Proceeds:** Finance has moved the proceed funds into a short-term CD, as we have time to have a plan in place/task force formed for what the next steps are for the proceeds. Joan has volunteered to lead this endeavor, what the next steps are, and work to put a taskforce together. Discussion ensued. We need to make sure that ALL voices are heard with ideas. This is a time for discernment – how can we be best stewards of our funds/ upgrades to advance our mission statement/seeking to do God's will. Pastor will reach out to Pastor Dave Daubert for any thoughts or suggestions, as he was our ministry strategy leader. Info for the newsletter is needed – what the next steps are, what/who is needed, what is the process.

**Motion was made for Joan Hamm to be the lead executive coordinator for the process/ direction/taskforce in handling the proceeds from the parsonage sale; motion was seconded and approved.

- Website: Rob and Sue gave an overview of where the new website is currently. The new site is live, but it is unfinished. We've had a few difficulties with the new platform and design team. This is being worked on.
- GPOD: 8.11–Jo; 8.18-Chris; 8.25–Joan; 9.1- Dave; 9.8-Carla

New business:

- **Ministry Team Restructure:** Rob went over the restructuring process and asked for feedback. All seems to be going well, no concerns. He encourages all ministries to submit a report for council.
- **Finance Audit Plans:** Documents (job descriptions) of all components of finance have been worked on and almost completed. Goal for the first quarter of next year to have detailed financial audit and introduce these documents. Guidelines from the Synod have been used. It is good practice to hold financial audits.
- **Stewardship:** No appeal this year. The Stewardship campaign will take place from the end of September until October 19/20 (pledge weekend). Pastor will lead a sermon series and temple talks will take place.
- **Fundraisers:** A quilt raffle will take place in October. Tickets will be sold. A "Garage Sale" was discussed, and Carla was asked if she was interested in leading this, but at this time, she is unable. This will continue to be mentioned to see if there is any interest.
- Year-End Get-Together: Carla has opened her home to host a council/staff Christmas Party. Plans will be in the works and a date to be set. Thank you, Carla!

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded, and meeting adjourned at 8:20pm.



Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women

The Loved By God committee has been working to educate ourselves on the continuing issue of Missing and Murdered Indigenous women.

Did you know that ... **

On some reservations, Indian women are murdered at more than 10 times the national average. American Indians and Alaska Natives are 2.5 times as likely to experience violent crimes and at least 2 times more likely to experience rape or sexual assault crimes compared to all other races, according to the National Congress of American Indians.

More than 4 in 5 American Indian and Alaska Native women, or 84.3 percent, have experienced violence in their lifetime according to the National Institute of Justice. More than 4 in 5 American Indian and Alaska Native men, or 81.6 percent, have experienced violence in their lifetime according to the National Institute of Justice.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, homicide is the third leading cause of death among American Indian and Alaska Native women between 10 and 24 years of age and the fifth leading cause of death for American Indian and Alaska Native women between 25 and 34 years of age.

Investigation into cases of missing and murdered Indian women is made difficult for Tribal law enforcement agencies due to a lack of resources, such as necessary training, equipment, or funding; a lack of interagency cooperation; and a lack of appropriate laws in place. The complicated jurisdictional scheme that exists in Indian country has a significant negative impact on the ability to provide public safety to Indian communities; has been increasingly exploited by criminals; and requires a high degree of commitment and cooperation among Tribal, Federal, and State law enforcement officials.

CELEBRATING THE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF NORTHEAST OHIO

Have you noticed that more states are recognizing the indigenous peoples of the United States on Columbus Day? In fact, some states are no longer calling the mid-October holiday (on October 14th in 2024) by the traditional name of Columbus Day, but rather, are now celebrating it as Indigenous Peoples Day. Our own ELCA has recognized the colonizing impacts of the past and present by launching the Truth and Healing Movement as part of the churchwide Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations faction of our larger church body.

In conjunction with this, our own Loved By God Ministry is sponsoring an outing! We are touring the Indian Museum of Lake County, Ohio on Saturday, October 19th at 1pm. We will be receiving our own private tour hosted by the director who will talk to us about the native peoples in and around northeast Ohio. People have lived here as long ago as 10,000 years and many of their artifacts are from that time. A sign-up sheet will be in the narthex and directions are easy since it is right here in Lake County. We will not car pool officially. However, those going are free to make arrangements. The museum is at 7519 Mentor Ave., Suite A112. This is in the BACK of the strip mall on Mentor Ave. just west of the mall.
