

pastor's Message

A few days ago, I participated in an over-night retreat at the Loyola Retreat House in Clinton OH. This retreat was part of my duty as a member of our Synod Council. You may, or may not, even be aware that I have been serving on the Synod Council of the Northeastern Ohio Synod (NEOS) Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA.) In my work as your pastor, I often become so involved in issues within the congregation, I don't spend enough time lifting up the good work of our Bishop and her staff. The ELCA is divided into 65 geographical Synods which are comprised of congregations, authorized ministries such as camps, colleges and universities as well as social service organizations. The Synod staff are in charge of the oversite of all these entities and for providing pastoral care to both clergy and congregations. Too often, many in our congregations only encounter our Synod staff during a pastoral vacancy or when there is a problem. Yet, they offer many resources to all of us, and I am going to try and do better in keeping you informed about these resources that may help you in your discipleship.

A great place to start is pointing you our Synod website: https://www.neos-elca.org

On this website you will find a heading called "For Congregations" -- check it out! Pay special attention to the "One Church Experiment" and "Growing in Faith" -- the first is a new initiative encouraging creativity in ways we are Church to the world. The second is an opportunity for study online that fosters individual growth and leadership potential for us in our congregations.

Also, please click the "connect" button to sign up to receive the weekly newsletter of the Synod (Walking Together) if you are not already on the mailing list. And, as you check out other offerings on this site, remember that if you have any questions about the work of the NEOS – just ask!

Pastor's Report: verbal

- ◆ Thank you for all the hard-work on the Day of Service all went well, and worship was well attended.
- Pastor will be out of town from September 16-20, he will be back for worship the following weekend.
- Pastor will undergo outpatient surgery on October 7. He will be working from home/resting that week.
 - **Motion was made and seconded, and Pastor's report was approved.

Treasurer's Report:

- We are doing well through August.
- Income 3.7% above plan and expenses -1.0% below
- Some ministry teams are under budget, a few are over due to some larger expenses
- The Parsonage proceeds total is listed on the Funds page, under the Misc category.
- 2025 budgets will be due by the end of September. Please relay info to your ministry teams. If you are increasing your budget, please make note of what the increase is for, as this helps for planning purposes.
 - **Motion was made and seconded, and the August Treasurer's report was approved.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, Fellowship, LBG and Prayer (on file)

- ◆ LBG: Trip to the Indian Museum coming up. Plans in the works for an Indigenous worship service. Inclusive Language forums planned September 15 and September 21/22
- Fellowship; many fellowship opportunities. Saturday potluck on September 14. Election Day soup and bakery sales. Help is needed in all areas (food donations, greeters, parking attendants. We need some men to help on this day).
- **Property:** sprinklers are turned off. We have had 3 leaks so far this year. Do we continue with this system or leave the system off and use volunteers/sprinklers to water the beds?
- ◆ **Technology:** Sanctuary computer has been replaced. It's been quite a challenge. Live streaming should be possible for this coming weekend. Thank you to Andy and his sons, who have been helping to get the new computer purchased, and up and running.
- Outreach: Thank you to all the team leaders for the Day of Service. Everything went smoothly thanks to your leadership! Food Pantry Dave shared some info from St. Andrew, in that their finances are down. We will continue to do our part and fund some of the pantry expenses. We need to think of some ways to help with additional financial support. Can we get a grant from the Lutheran Church to help support? Thrivent was mentioned. Community needs are increasing. The pantry served approx. 30 families in 2020/2021; we are currently serving approx. 50/60 families per month.
- Finance: we have 3 new counters that have volunteered, still looking for 1 more. We will have enough people now so that every weekend is covered in a counting team.
- ◆ H&W: Flu shot and Covid shot clinic at Advent on October 6. Sign up in the Narthex.
 - **Motion was made and seconded, and the Ministry reports were approved.



Some Important News for Seniors

The Council on Aging along with Lake County's Fire Departments have partnered to conduct the Vial of Life Program. The primary purpose of the vial of life program is to provide important medical information at the time of a medical crisis.

The vial of life is a simple form containing medical and emergency information that is placed in a highly visible red magnetic pouch. The pouch is then placed on the refrigerator door. Emergency medical personnel are trained to look for the pouch when entering an older person's home. If the vial of life is available, it can assist the EMS in treating the person in his or her home. They also will take the vial of life if the person is being transported and give it to the emergency personnel for their use.

When someone requests the vial of life, a Council on Aging staff person will assist the individual in completing the document.

The vial of life is available through the Council on Aging at no cost to any Lake County resident over the age of 60 +. All that is required is a simple phone call to the Council on Aging at 440-205-8111 to request the vial.

Another important benefit of being a senior resident of Lake County is that your local Fire Department will provide a lock box for your house key, so it will not be necessary for them to break down your front door in case of an emergency. Simply contact your local fire department and ask about the free lock box for seniors to get all the details.


