pastor's Message

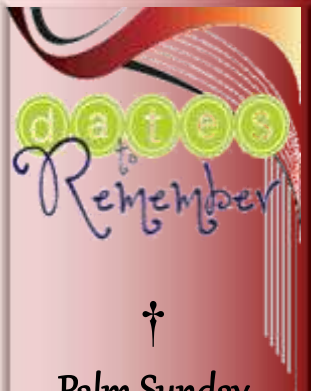
Allow me to share one of my favorite sermon illustrations once again: Imagine two children – both about the age of 6, both in an unfamiliar place. The place is downtown Manhattan in the middle of the day. Crowds of people are rushing pass the children in all directions. Many are shouting loudly, some of them in languages they can't understand. Looking up, the buildings are so tall it makes the children dizzy. They have never been here before. One of the children is terrified. He cries because of the fear and is paralyzed by that fear. The other child looks around in wide eyed wonder. The sights and sounds, though unfamiliar are a new adventure. The child is excited and expectant – the world itself is a place to be explored and discovered. What makes each child react so differently. The first is lost and alone. The second is holding hands with his loving parent who promises to be his guide on this new adventure.

This month we observe the most holy of weeks – the weeks of Christ's passion. His betrayal and his death. And we also celebrate His resurrection—God's miracle of new life. Knowing that Christ has died, as we all must and that we will one day rise as he has allows us to know we have a loving guide who can walk us through unfamiliar places. We need but just take God's hand.

But, how do we hold the hand of a God whom we cannot see. How do we walk though a life where so much we thought was certain is being called into question. A world where civil rights are being ignored, ally's are being treated as enemies, structures and programs we have grown to depend on are being dismantled. How do we hold onto our God? First, we remember that even if we don't feel we can hold onto God, God has promised to hold on to us.

But, I've also come to experience that the God who became incarnate in Christ Jesus – continues to put flesh on in order to speak to us and hold our hands. It happens when we draw close to our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ – reach out to your Church family. It happens when God speaks to us through scripture and the proclaimed word – read your Bible and attend worship to hear God in preaching. It happens when we lift our voices in song—or listening to music that soothes our soul and gives us courage. It happens when we take our cares to God in prayer – talk to God—God is listening – reaching out a strong and loving hand. I promise.

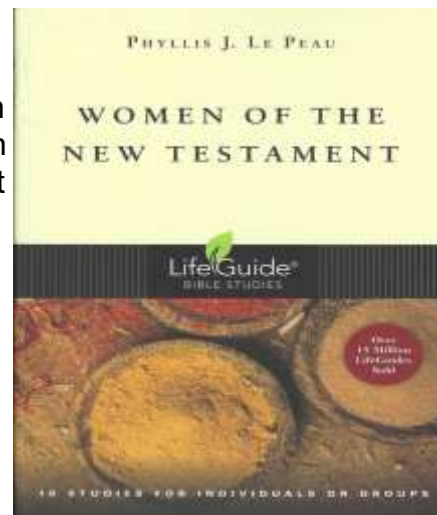

Council Minutes - February

Call to Order: 6:55pm

Approval of January Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report: verbal

- Following a survey of Lenten mid-week services (noon vs. 7pm), it has been decided that mid-week Lenten services will only be held at noon with a luncheon following. No evening mid-week services. Ash Wednesday worship will be held at both noon and 7pm. We will be using Sanctified Art.

**Motion was made and seconded, and the Pastor's report was approved.

Treasurer's Report:

- January good month – good start to the year.
- Income: \$40,302; Expenses: \$28,482 (property insurance increased \$2600/year).
- Funds page now lists “where our money is” - Checking and Money Market totals, CD amounts and maturity dates. The Parsonage CD is coming due in March, but it will be reinvested at this time.

**Motion was made and seconded, and January Treasurer's report was approved.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, Fellowship, W&M, Property, LBG, Witness (on file)

- **LBG:** Pizza & Movie Event in March; Finnish Museum Event in April. In light of world news, we need to be aware of possible protestors (being an RIC congregation) – be observant! Fernanda has been helping with social media (FB). If you have an event you would like posted on our FB page, please let Fernanda know.
- **W&M:** attendance trends for 2023 and 2024 were done by the W&M team. Our attendance has increased by 10%. Discussion about the trends ensued. We will have a joint Easter Vigil again this year, hosted by Celebration Lutheran Church.
- **Fellowship:** “Valentine Event” was held on Sunday, good attendance and a good time of fellowship!

**Motion was made and seconded, and the ministry reports were approved.

Administration/Housekeeping Items:

- Devotion for March – Carla Colo
- Council sharing of blessings and/or concerns

Old Business:

- **Parsonage Steering Committee:** First meeting went well. Next meeting is on February 13. The group is discussing best practices for collecting ideas/suggestions from members. Focus groups, electronically (survey), hard copy (mail). This group is collecting ideas, not decision makers. All ideas need to be submitted and not told to a committee member.

- **Changes in 2025:** no suggestions for any changes. It was noted that listing the upcoming GPOD's on the agenda is a good idea.
- **Code of Ethics:** Code of Ethics and Council Covenant were emailed to all council members for reading/review. The council all signed the covenant (to be kept on file in the office).
- **Offering Plate Issues: discussion** ensued about some concerns of late. There will now be 2 offering plates in the Sanctuary. Members will be asked to place their donations in the plate at the beginning of the service. That plate will be taken to the altar for the offering blessing prior to communion. The second plate will be left at the back of the Sanctuary for post worship collection of any offering. Andy is working on camera/security measures – will keep council posted. Discussion about who should be taking the offering to the counter box. We are going to try and have 2 people do this – usher and GPOD. This will work for 9am but will need to figure out the best practices for 4pm and 11:30am worship.
- **GPOD:** 2.16- Rob; 2.23 -Joan; 3.2-Bob M; 3.9-Rob; 3.16-Joan; 3.23-Leesa; 3.30-Leesa

New business:

- **Endowment Position Appointments:** Melissa Sommers has agreed to serve another term and Jerry Frye has agreed to serve on Endowment.
**Motion was made to approve Melissa Sommers and Jerry Frye to serve on Endowment, motion was seconded and approved.
- **Allegations against Lutheran Church:** world news. The Lutheran Church has been accused of laundering money (Lutheran Social Services). Both Bishop Eaton and Bishop Barbins have done video message/responses to these allegations. The work of the church (social services) has been ongoing for over 80+ years – helping those in need, worldwide.
- **Time Capsule:** when will it be opened this year? We need to set a date and get the word out to the congregation. This was put together 25 years ago.

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded, and meeting adjourned at 8:07pm.

We have created 60-80 quilts yearly that are donated to Lutheran World Relief, Appalachian Disaster Relief, comfort quilts for our sick members and baby quilts for christenings. Additionally, we make pot holders for our new members. We require fabric and batting for the projects. We welcome donations of cotton or cotton polyester material, but we cannot use microfiber or polyester-only fabric. We welcome top sheets of any size if you are cleaning out closets. The rolls of batting that we purchase cost \$180 per roll and we have required 3 rolls yearly. Our 10-12 quilters welcome your donations to continue our mission.

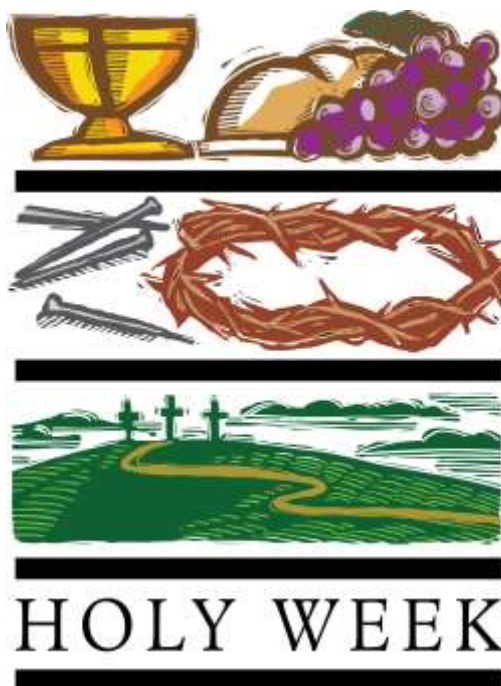
