As I write this, I'm still "basking in the glow" of our Easter celebrations. We experienced some beautiful worship services all through Holy Week, a glorious Easter Vigil with three other congregations, a Sun-rise service without snow or rain (at times like these I appreciate the fact that our weather people often get it wrong). Then, the nearly full pews on Easter led to such joyful singing! I give God and you all thanks for showing up and creating such a blessing!

We continue to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord throughout the month of May and into June. Easter is a season – a "week of weeks"—7 Sundays to reflect on the meaning and impact of the resurrection on our lives.

Yet, as important as the resurrection is, I am also aware of the reality that, for many, it sometimes just doesn't feel like all things are made new. Because of events in your life or in the world around you, you might be experiencing emotions more suitable to Good Friday or Holy Saturday. The fact is, until God's reign is here in all its fullness, we live in that in between time. Jesus' rising from the dead leads to faith that we, too, will one day rise. Jesus has defeated the power of death – but death is no less real and, the good news of the resurrection might just seem too good to be true. In fact, scripture is filled with stories that remind us that even the first followers of Jesus didn't come to belief easily.

So, come to worship regularly to celebrate the resurrection – or, come because you are having a hard time believing and need to be told the story again. But come – see the place where they laid him. Listen, He is calling out your name.


SUNDAY MORNING ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL BEGINS A NEW STUDY

Approval of February Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report: verbal

LBG Event – Pizza and Movie went very well. Good attendance and well received.

Debrief "event" from Saturday night. Discussion ensued about a visitor that attended the pizza dinner following the movie and then stayed for worship; caused some disturbance in the Narthex.

Treasurer's Report:

No report for council (Dave out of town). The report will be done after Dave returns from vacation. No report for the April newsletter.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, Fellowship, LBG, (on file)

LBG: Pizza & Movie Event was well received and had good attendance.

H&W: March 21 at 1:30pm will be a training for Eucharistic Ministers. Please let Chris Noble know if you are interested in this ministry.

Minutes from Ministries: just as a follow up from last month's meeting — ministry "minutes" that have not been approved by the individual ministry teams (prior to council) can be presented to council, but they will not be "approved" by council.

Faith Formation: A meeting is being planned with Beth Hamilton, Leesa Mecozzi, Pastor Steve and Joan Hamm. Discussion about VBS – whether it will take place this year or not.

Old Business:

Parsonage Steering Committee: next meeting March 20. Survey being worked on to be sent via email. A survey will also be mailed to those who do not have email. Team discussing small group meetings for gathering ideas.

Allegations against the Lutheran Church: Global Refuge/Lutheran Social Services of America have been targeted and accused of money laundering – per the current administration. Groups of churches have filed lawsuits against this and the ELCA has chosen not to join in the lawsuit.

Offering Plate Issues: the filled offering plate is now being taken to the altar during the service for a blessing (before the communion liturgy). Two people are then taking the collection to the counters box post worship – this is a good security practice, as well as a good reminder to the congregation that we are still taking donations (even know we are not passing the plate).

A congregation member asked if a hymn could be sung after the collection plate is taken to the altar (as done in the past). This will be taken to W&M for discussion.


