pastor's Message

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ. Have you ever felt that your life was too routine? Too comfortable? Maybe it is time to look for the new thing that God has in mind for your life.

Lately, I have been thinking a lot about being made new. Throughout this Easter season we've heard how God is doing a new thing – bringing new life out that which is dead, creating a new heaven and a new earth. In the midst of my thoughts, I found myself asking "How?" – How is God making (or going to make) all things new. I cannot answer this definitively but, I suspect that new life comes in ways that might surprise us – not through extraordinary miracles as one might expect need to occur—but through the common, ordinary, very human stuff that God takes so much pleasure in using.

Think about it...new relationships or friendships often start with a chance meeting or a simple introduction. New skills are learned often begin with a simple question: "I wonder if I could.... (you fill in the blank)? Our world expands through learning (it could be in a class, or on a YouTube clip or from reading a book, or...the possibilities are infinite.)



SUNDAY MORNING ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CONTINUES



Approval of March Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded and approved.

Treasurers Report:

- Income 23,445 and Expenses 27,458
- YTD 1st QTR: Income 86,570 -1.6% while Expenses are 80,812 and 1.3%.
- There will be no 1st Qtr. statements mailed out this year due to high cost of postage. Members can request copies of their statements from Becky Spudich or Sue Keeley.

**Motion was made and seconded, and the March Treasurer's report was approved.

Ministry Reports Received: H&W, Witness & Fellowship (on File)

- Youth & Family: Leesa reported that since we are not having Vacation Bible School this summer, they are looking into having a few weekend family activities.
- **Property:** Andy said he is looking into having soaker hoses with timers controlling the front flowers and memory garden this summer.
- **Security:** Chris Noble and Bob Adkins will try and assist Andy in evaluating and recommending a company that can improve the locks on our doors with cameras and audio to safely monitor and communicate with anyone requesting entry and to have cameras recording sensitive areas. By forming a committee, we hope to be able to keep this important program moving forward.
- Witness: June 7th has been selected for a New Member reception.
- **Motion was made, second, and the Ministry reports were accepted.

Old Business:

- **Offering Plate System**: New procedures are in place and finalized that allows collections to be brought up to the altar during the service and better secured after.
- Parsonage Fund Steering Committee: On May 1st a survey will be emailed out to all congregational members. Those without emails on file will receive a printed copy via the post office. A few additional copies will also be available for those who did not receive one. Member will be encouraged to submit has many ideas as they want as to how we can best utilize this fund to spread God's Love to our members and the community. On June 1st the surveys will be collected and tabulated. Ther will be an article in the Newsletter along with announcements and a temple talk to help better explain what the committee hopes to achieve with this survey. They have a tentative goal set for the annual meeting to complete their task and report back to the congregation.
- **Time Capsule Plans:** Council approved Fellowships' suggestion to review the contents of the time capsule during the potluck dinner for our Day of Service. A tentative date has been set for September 7th.

• **Synod Assembly:** Chris Noble and Rob Hilston have agreed to represent Advent along with Pastor Steve.

New Business:

- **Sabbatical** July was suggested as a time for all ministry teams to take some time off, reflect on and rejuvenate This is not mandatory. There will not be a council meeting or an executive meeting in July.
 - **Motion was made and seconded and then approved.
- Finance Committee Update: Bob reported that the committee hopes to have a formal report to the council by late summer. This will include Synod documents for audit procedures and Best Practice guidelines. Finance committee work instructions, Advent's Finance Best Practices, along with audit findings and recommendations.
- Bob Adkins will not be present for May's Exec and Council meeting and Joan will miss the June meetings.
- Dave and Bob volunteered for GPOD on May 18th and 25th respectively.

Carla Cola thanked everyone for their support and prayers.

Carla led the closing.

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded and approved. Meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm
