

pastor's Message

I've struggled the past few days trying to decide what to talk about in this monthly message. Three days ago, a person I (honestly) had never heard of, was brutally murdered and the reaction on all sides has been sad and scary. More than ever, I am convinced that the good news of Jesus is that God is reconciling the world although "my eyes do not see" it, so my faith is necessary now, more than ever. Anyway, in the midst of my struggle, I was glad to see that our Bishop had a word for the Church:

A message from Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton:

As presiding bishop of this church, I want to address yesterday's shooting in Utah. Charlie Kirk, known by millions for his views and videos supporting right-wing ideas, died by another senseless act of political violence. He was exercising his First Amendment right of free speech when he was shot and killed. This continues a long streak of political violence that shows no sign of subsiding. We've witnessed an attack on the husband of former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, two attempts to assassinate President Donald Trump during last year's campaign, the murder of two Minnesota state lawmakers, an arson attack on the home of Pennsylvania's governor, a plot to kidnap Michigan's governor, and too many more.

As I wrote last year, after the attempt on President Trump's life in Butler, Pa., "God calls this church to say a definitive 'no' to political violence now and in the future. Political violence has a long history but no place in democracy. This church belongs to God, and our unity in Christ is a grace-filled and healing gift in a fractured society."

This church teaches that disagreement is healthy and can lead to greater understanding and cooperation. But we have lost that sense of respectful debate and have degenerated into a society that treats differing opinions as personal attacks, erasing the humanity of some and abandoning the gospel of Jesus Christ.



Approval of June Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report: verbal

Thank you to the congregation for the support of our July sabbatical month.

Fall is approaching, Sunday school begins, and meetings and events will be in full swing.

**Motion was made and seconded, and pastor's report was approved.

Treasurer's Report:

Income below -5.6% (\$10,265.55) and Expenses under budget 0.1% (\$199.52 – on target).

Ministry teams doing well – some over, some under budget for the year to date.

General Memorial Fund: this fund has over \$18,000.00 in it. This will be discussed under old business for an upcoming usage of this money.

**Motion was made and seconded, and the July Treasurer's report was approved.

** Motion was made to approve the June treasurer's report, seconded, and the June report was approved.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, Fellowship, Finance, W&M (on file)

Property; backflow device is in place. Our plumber said that this will require a yearly inspection from the water company.

LBG: book study begins tomorrow, August 12 at 7pm.

DOS: September 7. Some projects are in place but still looking for any other ideas for projects. Sign up sheets are in the Narthex. "Fill the Pantry" was suggested.

Witness: a new member date will be set, as we have visitors wanting to join.

Fellowship: this Sunday will be an Ice Cream Social between services.

H&W: August 30/31, being a fifth Sunday weekend, Healing Touch will be offered at all worship services.

W&M: Carla Colo read a letter from our praise team director, about an idea/proposal for next year. It was discussed briefly, but will be readdressed at the beginning of next year, when the 2026 council is in place.

**Motion was made and seconded, and the ministry reports were approved.

Administration/Housekeeping Items:

- + Council is encouraged to write Ministry team reports and not just distribute minutes from meetings. Highlighted items for council knowledge.

Old Business:

Parsonage Fund Steering Committee Update: 73 responses to the survey were collected. The team has been busy working on analyzing the ideas presented. Next up is an educational piece to the congregation. Team is meeting this coming Thursday.

Cameras/Security System: a letter/proposal was read from Bob Adkins. 8 proposals for cameras/security have been received. Horner Network is being recommended for this new project totaling \$33,693.00. Key fob system, cameras/apps to open doors. Endowment has agreed to fund 70% of this project, leaving 30% for the church to fund. Thank you to the Endowment Committee. It was suggested that the 30% - approx. \$10,100, be taken from the General Memorial Fund. We will also have a dedicated "emergency" phone. This will be placed in the Narthex (red phone marked EMERGENCY). This will automatically dial 911 should the need arise.

** Motion was made that 30% of the cost of the security system be taken from Advent's General Memorial Fund, approximately \$10,100, motion was seconded, and approved by all.

Time Capsule/Day of Service: Pastor Steve will oversee the opening of the time capsule, which will occur immediately following worship, before the potluck on the Day of Service. Pastor will work with the Sunday school youth/church, about creating a new Time Capsule.

Finance Audit: Bob Adkins has been working on this and will present to council in September. Best practices, detailed work instructions, with Synod recommendations.

GPOD: schedule was passed around.

New Business:

Council 2026: brief discussion about those who are eligible to serve another term. Please be in prayer about continuing to serve and also be in prayer about leadership roles within council for next year. Bob Adkins and Joan Hamm are finishing terms.

Personnel Committee: Pastor would like to have a personnel committee reformed, as we've had in the past.

Stewardship Campaign: October 18/19 is Stewardship Weekend. Temple talks and a sermon series will be done leading up to Stewardship Weekend. The pledge mailing will be completed and mailed in September.

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 8:10pm.


