
God's Work ~ Our Hands Day of Service

• SUNDAY MORNING ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL BEGINS A NEW STUDY: The Parables were the greatest stories ever told. The parables of Jesus make up a crucial part of the Bible. Jesus had the wisdom to simplify the profound spiritual truths he needed to share with humanity in the

form of relatable stories that are easy to understand. A parable is a tale about a simple, common subject to illustrate a more profound, valuable moral lesson. The source definition of the word "parable" means a placement side by side for comparison.
