December is a month of contrasts. Advent invites us into quiet, hopeful waiting—candles lit one by one, promises whispered in Scripture. Yet our calendars often tell a different story: shopping lists, school programs, travel plans, and not nearly enough rest. By the time Christmas arrives, many of us feel worn down rather than lifted up.

Into all the noise comes John's Gospel with a simple truth: *there is darkness, but it does not win.* God's light shines right in the middle of our busy, complicated, joyful, and weary lives.

That is the heart of Christmas. God doesn't stay at a distance. In Jesus, God steps into our world, our stress, our questions, and our hopes—up close and personal. Christ comes not to overwhelm us but to be with us.

As we journey through Advent toward Christmas, I invite you to make space for Christ in a few simple ways:

Let worship anchor your month. Advent isn't just a countdown; it's a gift of time to prepare our hearts. I hope you'll join us for our Advent Sundays and our Christmas services of candlelight, carols, Word, and Sacrament.

Look for Christ in ordinary moments. A kind word, a shared meal, a quiet prayer, an act of generosity—these are places where Christ's light shines most clearly.

Remember those for whom this season is difficult. Christmas can stir up grief or loneliness. Reach out, care gently, and know that if this season is hard for *you*, your church family and your Lord walk with you.



Sunday School Adult Sunday School Begins a New Study

You are unique. You have been created and invited by God to participate in his kingdom-work. Council Minutes - October

Approval of September Council Minutes: Motion was made, seconded, and approved.

Pastor's Report: verbal

- We will celebrate Affirmation of Faith/Rite of Confirmation, on November 16, for 3 of our youth.
- Pastor Steve presented the following youths for approval: Brooklyn Walker, Audriana Walker and Evelyn Scripp.
 - **Motion was made to accept Brooklynn Walker, Audriana Walker, and Evelyn Scripp, for Affirmation of Faith on November 16; seconded; and approved by all.
- First Communion (3rd graders) we will have possibly 7 youth making first communion during holy week. Pastor currently is teaching the confirmation youth but will also need to teach the First Communion youth – leading up to holy week. This will be a conflict. If anyone is interested in helping with either group, please let Pastor Steve know.
- Pastor has been busy making visits and communion visits to our shut-ins.
- **Motion was made and seconded, and pastor's report was approved.

Treasurer's Report:

- Income below -5.% (\$11,297.90) and Expenses under budget 2.1% (\$5,213.96).
- Ministry teams currently under budget.
- In order to hit our \$213,000 budget, we will need to bring in \$4,000 over what we budget for income for the next 3 months.
 - ** Motion was made to approve the September Treasurer's report, seconded, and the September report was approved.

Ministry Team Reports Received: H&W, W&M, Fellowship (on file)

- **Property:** front beam (outside soffit) repair is complete. Soaker hoses worked great this year, they have been put away for the season. Boiler maintenance is done, AC window units have been taken out.
 - Ceiling lights in the Sanctuary need new bulbs, possibly new fixtures. What is the best way to go about this? Suggestion for getting scaffolding, not using ladders.
- Outreach: We received a nice thank you note from the Council on Aging, for work done for Mentor residents during our DOS. Thanksgiving/Christmas baskets will be done again this year, in conjunction with St. Andrew, for distribution at the Food Pantry. We are asking for financial donations, not food items.
- **W&M:** Carla is looking into getting special musicians for Easter/Reformation (2026) W&M has asked council to make a decision about a July Sabbatical for 2026 before February next year. This will be discussed with the new council in January. **Motion was made and seconded, and the ministry reports were approved.

Administration/Housekeeping Items:

Annual reports will be due by December 1.

Old Business:

• Parsonage Fund Steering Committee Update: team has planned a Congregational Workshop – Saturday, November 15 from 9am-2pm. Workshop will start as a group presentation, then small group work. Council is encouraged to attend. Priorities that are identified/finalized from this workshop will then be taken to council, who in turn will make a motion to the congregation to be voted on (January Annual Meeting). Sign-up sheets will be posted in the Narthex. Thank you to Joan, Dave and Kim for their leadership.

- Cameras/Security System and Key Policy: Horner is looking at installation around the end of October. Info will be placed in the November newsletter, as a "heads-up." Bob Adkins agreed to draft an article. The Emergency phone in the Narthex is working.
- **Election Day:** help is needed sign up sheets posted in the Narthex.
- Council 2026: 2 council members are needed. Pastor Steve is working on this.

New business:

- **Budget Planning Meeting: November** 19 at 7pm. Council and ministry team leaders are encouraged to attend.
- Living Lutheran Magazine: Magazine of the ELCA, has returned to hard-copy, from only electronic copies in previous years. Do we wish to renew this magazine for our members to pick up in the Narthex, if they wish? Carla Colo volunteered to make a donation to cover the cost of this subscription for 2026. Thank you so much Carla!
- Disaster Relief Plan: will be discussed in January.
- Christmas Party: does the council wish for a Christmas party this year? Yes. Carla Colo has graciously volunteered to host again this year. It will be December 14 at 4pm.
- **December Annual Meeting:** December 7 at 10am immediately following 9am worship.

Motion to Adjourn: Motion was made, seconded, and the meeting adjourned at 8:15pm.

Thank you, Advent Lutheran Family, for your work as God's Stewards. As a congregation we can do together what we cannot do alone.






